Also in our local communities recreational fishers have voiced extreme unrest about the loss of "Four setlines" in river systems west of the Great Divide and are keen to see resolve in these matters.

Previous decisions made in regard to inland fisheries regulations, seem to be made on little or no reserch, or no consultation with the regions to be affected by these restrictions and changes. Points of unrest:

\*Loss of revenue to government Eg; Boat licence/rego's, Fishing licences. leading to less funding for fisheries.

\*Loss of income to small communities along rivers.

\*Loss of sales to boat/fishing, bait & tackle outlets.

\*Younger Generation restricted in recreational choices.

\*Closuer of Recreatioal Fishing Clubs due to lack of interest and no younger members joining.

\*In regard to the decline & stress on Native Species, all reports in our region, show

"exceptionally" good numbers of small fish are being caught and released, in the Murrumbidgee / Darling and Lachlan rivers.

\*Concerns about Water Flows, or Lack of them, in rivers and catchment areas leeding to large numbers of fish deaths due to this problem.

\*Damage to fish stocks and habitates would more prevelant due to the above mentioned, than Recreational Fishing causes.
