To the Committee on the planning process in Newcastle and the broader Hunter Region, I wish to make a submission to the committee on the roles of both the Newcastle and Lake Macquarie city councils in regards to the removal of the heavy rail at Wickham station and its subsequent replacement with light rail along Hunter and Scott streets, Newcastle.
