

The escarpment on our property supplies the water needs to properties below at Myocum and feeds the creeks that run all the way to Byron Bay.





## **Zone E2 Environmental Conservation**

### 1 Objectives of zone

- To protect, manage and restore areas of high ecological, scientific, cultural or aesthetic values.
- To prevent development that could destroy, damage or otherwise have an adverse effect on those values.
- To identify and protect environmentally sensitive coastal land and land likely to be influenced by coastal processes for present and future generations through the implementation of the principles of ecologically sustainable development.
- To prevent inappropriate development that would be adversely affected by, or that would adversely affect, coastal processes.

#### 2 Permitted without consent

Home occupations; Environmental protection works.

## 3 Permitted with consent

Boat sheds; Dwelling-houses in accordance with clause 7.8, 7.25 or 7.26; Environmental facilities; Home business; Home-based child care; Recreation areas; Roads.

#### 4 Prohibited

Business premises; Hotel or motel accommodation; Industries; Multi dwelling housing; Recreation facilities (major); Residential flat buildings; Restricted premises; Retail premises; Seniors housing; Service stations; Warehouse or distribution centres; Any other development not specified in item 2 or 3.

## **Zone E3 Environmental Management**

#### 1 Objectives of zone

- To protect, manage and restore areas with special ecological, scientific, cultural or aesthetic values.
- To provide for a limited range of development that does not have an adverse effect on those values.
- To limit soil erosion from scenic escarpment areas and prevent inappropriate development in geologically hazardous zones.
- To encourage passive recreation, environmental education and an understanding of natural systems where these activities will not have a detrimental effect on land within the zone.

#### 2 Permitted without consent

Extensive agriculture; Environmental protection works; Home-based child care; Home occupations.

## 3 Permitted with consent

Bed & breakfast accommodation; Boat launching ramps; Building identification sign; Business identification sign; Camping grounds; Community facilities; Dual occupancies (attached); Dwelling houses; Ecotourist facilities; Emergency services facilities; Environmental facilities; Farm buildings; Farm stay accommodation; Forestry; Flood mitigation works; Home business; Home industry; Horticulture; Jetties; Places of public worship; Public administration building; Recreation areas; Roads; Veterinary hospitals; Wharf or boating facilities.

# 4 Prohibited

Industries; Multi dwelling housing; Residential flat buildings; Retail premises; Seniors housing; Service stations; Warehouse or distribution centres; Any

other development not specified in item 2 or 3.
