* Protection of underground water basins.

- Corridors and shelter for native fauna and protection of remnant flora and substantial patches of flora.
- Prevention of destruction of trees by unnecessary clearing by farmers and road workers and unsustainable logging quotas e.g. in the Pillaga.
- Consideration of dark sky pollution by developments on Crown land e.g. coal seam fields near Siding Springs.
- Alienation of Crown land for the development of accommodation adjacent to National Parks.
