As administrator of The Forgotten 300 & 000's Facebook support pages for the past 4 years, I have been involved with listening and reading the hundreds and hundreds of tragic stories of injured Police, emergency services and veterans and their families secondary damage.

The most disturbing and dangerous aspects of the current system I have experienced are as follows;

What I call, 'Cash for Comment', so-called private insurance industry Independent medical Examiners who continue to fraudulently misrepresent reporting on the cases of injured workers for their own ongoing financial gain from the Insurance companies.

All of the current attitudes to and the practices and procedures of the insurance of Insurance company employees towards the injured worker.

Industry practises of delay, delay in requested medical treatment and operations, based on their own Cash for Comment doctors and so-called specialists.

The Governments of the day continually hiding behind the private insurance industry to balance the treasury managed funds at the expense of the injured workers.

The abuse and threats by these so-called Rehab providers who are briefed to focus on getting injured people back to some hours at any cost, instructed by the insurance companies, regardless of injuries and fitness for employment.

I have been informed by EML Insurance they have incentive programmes for the company and case managers to get people back to work quickly.
