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Inquiry into off-protocol prescribing of chemotherapy in New South Wales

My name is William Peters and I was diagnosed with Stage 4 Small Cell Lung Cancer in February 1995 and from March 1995 Dr Kiran Phadke has been the primary doctor in charge of my treatment.
