I am writing to oppose the construction of this incinerator at eastern Creek, or for it to be built anywhere. It is based on fact, unlike the proponents EIS, which has been rejected multiple times by the EPA.

To allow this building to be built would be horrible and history will look back and judge the authorities who do authorise it, I fear much the same way that people look back and judge asbestos and similar things which were authorised and caused many health problems.
