I am <u>opposed to option 1 - Windsor Bridge Replacement</u>. I am in favour of building a bypass instead. Thank you for reading my points listed below:

- 1. The bridge replacement is impractical and it doesn't solve traffic problems, instead contributes to long term traffic problems by keeping more traffic going through Windsor: A replacement bridge is cheaper than a bypass in the short term, yes. HOWEVER it is not a long term solution, or even a short term one as it will not fix the traffic flow problems, especially considering the residential developments and increase in trucks driving in the region.
