My daughter \_\_\_\_\_ who is 34 years, being a Type 1 diabetic, and having cerebral palsy, confined to a wheelchair, has now been a patient in \_\_\_\_\_ Hospital for 13 weeks, resulting from a group home in \_\_\_\_\_ where she was residing before being admitted into hospital, does not want to take her back due to her complex medical needs.

\_\_\_\_\_ is now deemed homeless.

Since \_\_\_\_\_ started with NDIS her world has turned upside down, not providing her with a GOOD LIFE, but a life to be far more complex, and unachievable, with no one able to provide the care and support \_\_\_\_\_ deserves.

In every case conference that is being held, there is mention of \_\_\_\_\_ going to a nursing home. This is no situation for a 34 year old, mentally, socially, emotionally is inappropriate. \_\_\_\_\_ deserves to be able to mix with her peers, as she does now by transitioning back to \_\_\_\_\_ and College, \_\_\_\_\_, from hospital to college each day. This area of her life has been another home to her as \_\_\_\_\_ has attended since leaving school.

The group home where \_\_\_\_\_ was residing in \_\_\_\_\_ before moving to \_\_\_\_\_ has left her with a lot of permanent and significant trauma both physically and emotionally due to the way she was treated.
