The NDIS federal scheme to provide comprehensive and satisfactory services to people with wider range of disabilities is a total failure. It is queasy impossible to have educated people on this complexity of knowledge. Just consider the differences of physical disabilities from intellectual and mental health, congenital and acquired disabilities, fistinguished the impacts on people's lives, recognizing their needs, awareness where goals can be achieved and where there is a natural process of deterioration due to complexity of needs and decline of cognitive capacity. My experience with disabilities comprises my professional involvement over 4 decades and private over 5 decades. My private experiences with disabilities begin with changing nappies that was as much as normal.... nowadays after 55 years I am in the same boat... nappies became regular part of my life. Yet the NDIS cut funding for my daughter and recommed increase her independence. The planner did not have any knowledge about dual diagnoses, did not have knowledge of long term usage of psychotropic drugs on frontal lobe centrum of short and long term memoirs. I am not the only onewho experiencing this frustrations with inadequate NDIS frontline staffing. We, parents and primary carers who are entering the stage of frail age have a serious concerns for the future of our children safety and care. It is inevitable a radical changes to the NDIS services, policies, eligibility, and especially employment of educated staff.
