*The privatisation of our state's disability sector has changed the face of care in NSW.

<u>Provision of care for our most vulnerable has now become a business rather than a service.</u>

Everything done is equated in time, staffing, kilometres etc and it all boils down to dollars and cents.

Providers are looking to cut costs in every area available which hardly fits the picture of care and compassion.

*Why does the NSW Government play no role in the care of disabled people any longer? Historically, the hardest to manage people that NGOs couldn't accommodate ended up in the care of the state. Now if they fail in a private system there is nowhere appropriate left for them to go.

It's supposed to be about choice and control but that seems to be just words. There is no choice and no control when there is just one big provider for the whole area. Perhaps it will end up like a Coles/Woolworths duopoly with only a couple of providers for the whole state.
