## Re: Inquiry into Cemeteries and Crematoria Amendment Regulation 2018

It is crucial and necessary that any amendment to or consideration of legislation regarding this sensitive matter account for the requisite catering to the needs and traditions of new, emerging and established CALD communities present in NSW.

The ECC NSW is available in perpetuity as a body that can advise the State Government and appropriate regulatory bodies, agencies, private businesses or individuals on the appropriate community representative and cultural bodies, leaders and individuals with whom to best liaise now and into the future on the conduct of burials and burial practices as regards to specific communities.

Further, the ECC NSW is committed to assisting wherever possible in facilitating appropriate advice and guidance on these matters, and remains an avenue, together with our Federal umbrella body, the Federation of Ethnic Communities' Councils of Australia (FECCA), for the State Government and necessary services to best source and connect with appropriate representatives from a range of CALD communities.
