SUBJECT Inquiry – Water NSW Amendment (Warragamba Dam) Bill 2018

Council continues to engage with the Traditional Owners in relation to Aboriginal culture and heritage implications of the proposal.

The Council understands that an Aboriginal Place listing under the *National Parks and Wildlife Services Act* has been lodged by the Traditional Owners and urges the Inquiry to take this into consideration.
