They have no access to sun, fresh air or the ability to walk and stretch their wings.

Cruelty in the name of extra profits is simply no longer acceptable in today's Australia.

It must be no longer tolerated.

Australia is better than this. There are no excuses whatsoever to allow this cruel practice to continue. I sat in the gallery in the House of Commons to witness the passing of legislation banning leg hold traps in 1958, termed "diabolical instruments of torture" by one MP.

It took many years for New South Wales to do the same, a campaign I was involved with in 1972. Is it possible for the New South Wales Government to show leadership and rid us of these diabolical cages?
