As a mining environment and safety inspector from the Queensland border to Namoi river at Walgett, I often saw koalas. Singly, on the ground or up trees. I probably had 20 or 30 sightings over a wide area over a 10 year period. without looking! I retired in 2012.

In the six years since about 2013, whilst I looked and asked I can not get a single sighting report in the above mentioned area. ! Previously, I had seen a koala in the tree outside my office in Lightning Ridge on two occasions. In a tree at our mining camp.
