Measurement and Outcome based funding in New South Wales Schools Submission by:

My name is and I am an ex-school NSW school teacher and up until recently, was an Educator for youth employed by an NGO to deliver professional sexual health training to NSW school teachers, people who work (including voluntary work) with young people eg young people and on occasion, directly educate NSW school students.

The documents I wish to submit are:

- (a) The Safe Schools Coalition Australia Trainer's Manual; and
- (b) The Key Session Plans.

These documents are submitted under terms of reference 1(c), (d) (e) and (f) and 1 (g) (not limited to) and for the following reasons (and not limited to):

- (i) It is my belief that the NSW Health Ministry has continued to fund teacher training uses material and objectives from this program to train teachers in NSW Schools with the NSW Education Department's knowledge.
- (ii) I am concerned about the lack of public transparency and accountability surrounding the teachings of this program in the past and currently, to NSW teachers and students and I continue to be seriously concerned, regardless if State government funded or not. For example, the public has continually been told that Safe Schools was an anti bullying program yet, page 15 of this submission under the heading 'Considerations' in the Safe School Program, clearly states, "it is not an anti-bullying program" but "rather a program that aims to create educational environments that allow same sex attracted, gender diverse, and intersex people to be themselves and enjoy positive wellbeing and learning outcomes".
- (iii) I am concerned about the lack of accountability of external service providers providing training to NSW teachers and in NSW schools.

I wish to make this a public submission (including the program and session plans) with my name redacted. I make this submission with the reassurance of parliamentary privileges that are extended to those who make submissions and as a whistleblower.

I wish to be called as a witness wherein I will provide a further (very lengthy) submissions to support the relationship of this program to the terms of reference I have referred to and more of the Safe School program as well as, a copy of programs currently being used to train NSW teachers in gender theory, sexual health and consent. I am very concerned about the content of those topics in teacher training programs.

I believe the submission of these documents and further evidence I can provide is necessary for the Committee to be able to consider the need for better measurement and outcome-based funding that will be transparent and measured and most of all, be an avenue that could assist in the scrutiny of "program objectives" to meet outcome based funding and measurement.
