As a former long-time resident of McGraths Hill and Windsor, we moved away because of what we witnessed as many suspect land fills on local flood prone areas. One was pulled off by a neighbour on Old Hawkesbury Rd who got himself onto Hawkesbury Council for one term with the sole purpose of re-zoning a nearby parcel of land supposedly for his horses - he put 4 houses up on that rise!

There is also many little spots around Pitt Town, Bligh Park, Yarramundi and Agnes Banks where suspect land fill has occurred. The thing with land-fill is that it doesn't save people from acute water inundation, the waters just flow wider for longer.
