INQUIRY INTO PROVISIONS OF THE RIGHT TO FARM BILL 2019

The right to farm bill is an aggressive step towards enforcing a regime that has echoes of historical dictatorships that protect so-called leaders' financial investments without any evidence to support that they are protecting the interests of the public.
