In the recent case of Nathan Sanger, 20, he mowed down 20 eastern grey kangaroos by going on a rampage in his ute on the south coast of New South Wales in September. He pleaded guilty to one count of torturing, beating and killing an animal in relation to the attack.

Eleven kangaroos were killed and a number of others were injured in the attack, including joeys not properly developed in the mothers pouch and joeys that were with their mother.

All this person received as punishment was a two year intensive corrections order and was ordered to serve 500 hours of community service. This is not good enough.

Animal cruelty should be dealt with severely. We need harsher penalties. The punishment by prison sentence, no less.
