Q.1. Should Exotics still be used in Marine Parks and Circuses?

I grew up travelling and performing with Ashtons Circus along with all of my large and extended family. We all grew up surrounded by lions, tigers ,elephants, monkeys, horses, dogs and more. It was from my early childhood with them, watching and learning from the adults, seeing their care, love and devotion, interacting with their animals, that I gained the understanding, love and respect that I myself, have for all animals today.

The animals led long happy, enriched lives and many of them were bred and hand raised in the circus. Some of them were taught to perform their natural movements on command, with a simple reward method, as many domestic pet owners do today.

Australian Marine Parks and Australian Circuses, should be rewarded and recognised for their own high standards of animal care, and not judged on the dramatic stories and footage taken from overseas.

With respect, I ask that the committee note, that the Australian Circus Industry is already of the highest standard, and that the use of of exotic and domestic animals in circuses, (and Marine Parks) should continue and remain unchanged, as they are already protected by their Compulsory Code of Conduct.
