My name is & I am the Captain & founder of A late 15th century Wars of the Roses living history group, I am also the head

for several groups including the & reconstructing period Armour , weaponry & equipment for our groups in order to provide accurate & affordable equipment so that when we perform for the public we are delivering a high quality & historically accurate display .

An essential part of our performances is the use of historical firearms, canon & prohibited weapons such as Daggers, Maces & Crossbows (all licences & permits are in place) & both safety & a high level of member training along with public liability cover etc is an important part of what we do.

As the manufacturers of Black powder & historical firearms etc are overseas, for example "Old Guard" in Poland, the maintenance, including minor repairs to this equipment has to be done by our own skilled individuals like myself,

It is also essential for our presentations to manufacture items such as mace, Flail or 15th century crossbow as they are aether to expensive to ship to Australia or they are simply not made by an historical manufacturer to a standard were they can be demonstrated safely or at all.

Our concern is that if Bill 2020 is passed it will restrict the ability of our groups to demonstrate a particular historical event accurately or to any historical standard.

Our organisations are in full support of firearm & weapon control in Australia but if Bill 2020 is passed we wish to at least have historical replica firearms & prohibited weapons for the purpose of re-enactment or collectors be exempt in order to continue being able to present our historical events & time periods accurately.
