As a retiree with an Aviation and Engineering background, and a restorer of vintage motorcycles, I have over the years amassed an array of both hand and machine tools necessary to maintain my vehicles in a safe and roadworthy condition. I also fly hand made model radio controlled aeroplanes and gliders To enable me to make the parts for restoration and construction I keep a quantity of steel, and aluminium in various sections, along with a large array of fasteners as a few of my motorcycles are from the early 1920's and parts are not commercially available, here or abroad. I am also a licensed firearms owner, and member of a local target shooting club. This proposed legislation, if passed leaves me in a position where, I either give up my hobbies, my Vintage motorcycles, Planes etc, not to mention the joy I gain from these activities and sell my tools, or surrender my firearms and license so as not to attract the attention of the authorities, and possibly attract a fine, incarceration or both, and have my firearms, tools, machinery and materials confiscated.
