Dear Sir/Madam,

For your Committee Inquiry, I wish to detail some of our experiences with Coffs Harbour Hospital. Experiences for which we still have yet to have our questions satisfactorily answered.

I am the carer for aged 67 who has several major health problems.

During our time in Coffs Harbour, since 2014, has spent time in Coffs Harbour Hospital on a number of occasions.

Serious incidents have occurred on the following occasions.

1. After being admitted to the ER on a Saturday night, I arrived at the Hospital on the Sunday morning to just catch her specialist leaving the hospital. I asked him how was doing. His answer was to question whether she was in fact in hospital as he had not been advised yet the hospital file was clearly marked who was her specialist. He immediately got his team to visit her in the ER. On arrival they found that ER staff were just about to give her drugs that could have further damaged her kidneys.

One must ask why was not informed that was in the Hospital? When I approached the Nursing Unit Manager I was informed that things fall through the cracks. Is it acceptable for a patient's kidneys to be damaged because she was given the wrong medication?

- 2. file was clearly noted that she had to be given Novorapid insulin prior to her meals. On one occasion two nice meals were delivered without the insulin being administered and the meals were let go cold and taken away. The result was that she was given a sandwich instead of a hot meal.
- 3. experience in the Medical Ward or Ward C has left a scar on her and she remains very anxious whenever that ward is mentioned. Several incidents there in memory for a long time.
- 4. When she arrived in the ward she was placed in a 4 bed ward and was opposite a lady called had been sent to the hospital and she appeared to have been made a prisoner. She had the same clothes on for four days and even her underwear was not changed. gave a dress to wear that was brand new and had just been washed. I went and bought some new underwear from Target and refunded me the purchase money.
- 5. After this all happened was chastised by nursing staff for being unhygienic yet it was the Hospital who allowed to sit there for four days without changing her underwear, isn't this really being unhygenic?
- 6. At no stage have our questions been answered and we have not been advised of any changes implemented to prevent a recurrence of these incidents.

I am sure there have been other incidents at this hospital.
