I have a 320 acre property on part of which I grow Blueberries and Olives. There is a small mob of eastern grey kangaroos which graze over my property, less than when I arrived here 20 years ago due to the subsequent unrestricted kangaroo culling practices of the neighbouring cattle farmer. The kangaroos prefer to graze the "rough" native grasses available on my land and have no interest in the crops I plant. Occasionally the neighbouring Hereford cattle break through the boundary fences , graze heavily on my crops and despoil the waterways in my valley. Deer from another neighbouring pine forest have proliferated over the last 5 years and cause considerable damage to the native regrowth and create soaks along the creeks interfering with the flow. It is obvious which species is a threat and unsustainable in the Australian environment . The practice of slaughtering a native species for no acceptable evidence based reason is disgraceful and a shame on our standing in the international community. I welcome any members of the committee to visit my farm to gain an understanding of the benign nature of kangaroos on the varied farming communities and the Australian landscape.
