The Aboriginal Kangaroo is on the Edge of Extinction in Victoria, they are-

The Western Grey Kangaroo Macropus fuliginosus – when historical distribution records are compared the species is missing from almost 50 per cent of its former range, shot commercially since 2014.

2019- western grey kangaroo, 12,568 or less.

The Eastern Grey Kangaroo Macropus giganteus – former range fractured and fragmented, shot commercially since 2014. 2019- eastern grey kangaroo, 161,000 or less.

The Red Kangaroo Macropus rufus – restricted in its declining range to far North West Victoria, the species used to occur in at least 50 per cent of Victoria. The species existence in Victoria is directly threatened by Victorian Government actions. 2019- Red Kangaroo, 15,187 or less.

The Toolache Wallaby Macropus grey is EXTINCT.

The Eastern Hare Wallaby Lagorchestes leporides is EXTINCT.

The Bridled Nailtail Wallaby Onychogalea fraenata is EXTINCT.

The Rufous-bellied Pademelon Thylogale billardierii is EXTINCT.

The Rufous Rat-kangaroo or Rufous Bettong Aepyprymnus rufescens is EXTINCT.

The Eastern Bettong Bettongia gaimardi gaimardi is EXTINCT.

The Woylie or Brush-tailed Bettong Bettongia penicillata is EXTINCT.

The Brush-tailed Rock-wallaby Petrogale penicillata ENDANGERED – Slaughtered to near extinction in Victoria, few individuals remain, in 1908 alone 92,590 skins were marketed by a single company.

The Long-footed Potoroo Potorous longipes ENDANGERED – population in decline.

The Long-nosed Potoroo Potorous tridactylus THREATENED – population in decline.

The Black Wallaby or Swamp Wallaby Wallabia bicolor - population appears stable.

ALL DUE TO COMMERCIAL KANGAROO INDUSTRY.

(the numbers don't overpopulate, the numbers only go so far when they wipe out the female and her joeys and the dominant big male)
