I am deeply concerned about the devastating impacts of native forest logging. I am concerned that unsustainable logging increases the fire risk, reduces carbon storage, damages water resources, seriously harms biodiversity and undermines eco-tourism. Public native forest logging needs to end with an immediate expansion of the plantation timber industry if we are to survive the climate catastrophe.
