Inquiry into the Petroleum (Onshore) Amendment (Cancellation of Zombie Petroleum Exploration Licences) Bill 2021

SUBMISSION: Caroona Coal Action Group Inc.

The Caroona Coal Action Group Inc. was formed in 2006, to object to the issuing of the BHP Caroona Coal Project Exploration Licence, followed by the issuing of Shenhua Watermark Exploration Licence (EL) in 2008, on the Liverpool Plains.

The Liverpool Plains is perhaps the most unique agricultural region of Australia with its rich black vertisol soils, ground and surface water and climate that allows both cropping and livestock to be produced 24/7 twelve months of the year and with important Indigenous heritage sacred sites as well as a significant koala habitat.

The EL licenses were issued without any prior consultation with local knowledge and obviously no investigations into the national importance of the region's agriculture. Therefore, these were the very reasons the community had to take a stand.

BHP relinquished their licence in August 2016, after establishing that their proposed mine would severely compromise the ground and surface water of the Liverpool Plains. This knowledge in hindsight, should have raised red flags and immediately been applied to the Shenhua Watermark licence, but unfortunately, it took five more years at huge expense to the farming community to uncover the science at test bore sites, which we were previously not allowed to access.

Shenhua Watermark Exploration Licence was extinguished April 21,2021 at Breeza hall with the words of Resources Minister and Deputy Premier John Barilaro 'I am today extinguishing the Shenhua Watermark Exploration Licence and there will be no more mining allowed on the Liverpool Plains, FOREVER'. In the written words of Planning Minister Rob Stokes to the writer: 'I assure you that the NSW Government considers that the agricultural land and water resources in the Liverpool Plains are incredibly important to our State'.
