4. The location of the dive site in Flat Rock Gully will be a contamination hazard due to the historical legacy of it being a tip site.

It is now an amazing wildlife corridor supporting a number of ecosystems, and amazing native wildlife including powerful owls, tree snakes, lorikeets, cockatoos, king parrots, wallabies, echidnas, kookaburras, magpies, possums, Urban bushland is fast disappearing please let this be. 6. Council has designated this bushland as a wildlife protection area as it provides significant habitats that support a wide range of birds – particularly small birds – mammals, reptiles and frogs and therefore should not be destroyed.
