Submission to the Inquiry into the Impact of the Western Harbour Tunnel and Beaches Link

I write to object strongly to the Beaches Link Tunnel and Warringah Freeway upgrade as set out in the current Environmental Impact Statement.

I agree with and endorse those Submissions from the Balgowlah Residents Group, the Baringa Bush Residents Group and most especially from the P&Cs of Balgowlah Boys High School, Seaforth Public School and St. Cecelia's Primary School.
