We are the Executive Committee of the Balgowlah Boys Secondary Campus, Basketball Program.

We have over 200 kids participating in local and representative competitions, having grown from 2 teams in 2017 to 30 teams in 2021. - provide new and improved learning environments for all students

- buffer the school from construction impacts

- secure the long term success of the growing schools population through improved access and amenities

- minimise the long term impacts of traffic flow changes and schools access
