To build the Beaches Tunnel I believe the extreme level of environmental destruction cannot be justified. It includes:

- more than 2,000 trees cut down with no local offset,

- killing a rare and valuable flying fox colony by removing their drinking water,
- wrecking Burnt Bridge Creek forevermore by effectively turning it into a drain;

- ruining the ecology and heritage of Manly Dam;
- placing massive unfiltered exhaust stacks near schools, childcare centres and homes.

In place of a tunnel we really need much better public transport improvements. The government has recently reduced bus services in this area in order to privatise them.
