# INQUIRY INTO IMPACT OF THE WESTERN HARBOUR TUNNEL AND BEACHES LINK

<u>Submission to the Parliament of New South Wales Inquiry into the impact of the Western</u>
Harbour Tunnel and Beaches Link

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Northbridge Progress Association (NPA) is a 100-year-old, not-for-profit, volunteer association which advocates on behalf of Northbridge to preserve or improve for its residents, the amenity and environment of the suburb. Northbridge is a strong community with over 6300 residents, proud of the physical attractions of our peninsular suburb and indigenous heritage.

The NPA is making this submission to the Inquiry because the Western Harbour Tunnel and Beaches Link project is of great interest to our members. Given the proposed design and tunnel path for the Beaches Link, the construction timeline and the overarching risk profile of this major infrastructure project, the potential impact on the residents and environment of Northbridge during and post construction is significant and undeniable.

In March 2021, the NPA made a submission to the New South Wales Government in response to its Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) published in December 2020, in which we objected to the project proposal and provided a number of recommendations to help address community concerns. The key elements of our submission address a number of the points in the Inquiry's Terms of Reference. These include particularly:

- the impact on the environment, including marine ecosystems;
- the adequacy of processes for accessing and responding to noise, vibration and other impacts on residents, during construction and operationally;
- the impact of the project on nearby public sites,
- the consultation methods and effectiveness, both with affected communities and stakeholders; and
- whether the project is subject to the appropriate levels of transparency and accountability.

Attached please find the NPA's detailed recommendations on the EIS, which we have provided in our submission to the NSW Government and have aligned to the Inquiry's Terms of Reference.

In developing the key points of our submission, the NPA held a Special General Meeting in February, at which Transport for NSW attended and responded to local concerns. Our submission outlined clear, actionable initiatives our community expects the Government to adopt to mitigate the impacts on Northbridge, should the project proceed. Since then, we have also held meetings with Government entities and stakeholders to discuss possible approaches to mitigating concerns, which have been very constructive.

In assessing the EIS for the Beaches Link, we took particular note of the NSW Parliament - Upper House Public, Accountability Committee Inquiry into the impact of the WestConnex project. We acknowledge that major infrastructure projects take into account broader considerations for Greater Sydney; however, Northbridge residents should not be required to shoulder a disproportionate share of the costs and risks of this project. The WestConnex Inquiry report's findings are aligned with the general concerns of the Northbridge community.

To meet community expectations, the NPA recommends that a number of the relevant recommendations from the WestConnex inquiry should be adopted and implemented in full for Beaches Link in order to minimise the impacts for the residents of Northbridge. In particular, we support the WestConnex report's focus on:

- achieving greater transparency in delivering major infrastructure projects;
- improving community consultation and complaints handling; and
- addressing construction impacts and preserving community amenities.

The general concerns of the Northbridge community, as outlined in the attachment, are centered around:

- existing contaminated landfill at Flat Rock Gully
- bushland preservation
- construction traffic
- noise and vibration impacts to residents
- air and water quality impacts
- access and amenity
- property impacts.

Our submission includes specific recommendations on important matters for our community including bushland rehabilitation, compensation for local organisations particularly impacted by the project, protection of aboriginal heritage and the scope of property pre-assessments.

Our community has highlighted the importance of transparency and accountability of government throughout this project, consistent with the Inquiry's Terms of Reference. This must include arrangements for ongoing monitoring and consultation to manage risks, mitigate impacts and ensure effective communication with the community through the construction and operational period. We have expressed clear expectations that material changes on key issues that impact the community e.g. deterioration in air quality above threshold levels; noise during construction above agreed thresholds; water quality changes that materially impact the use of Middle Harbour, are communicated to the public in a timely manner.

We recommend the performance of the construction project in identified key risk areas is communicated regularly in accessible formats, such as dashboard information presented in public community areas and online, in order to inform and engage the community.

Given the location of the proposed tunnel directly beneath the Northbridge peninsula, we have significant concerns about the potential for water-table drawdown leading to subsidence and property damage, as has been experienced by property owners affected by other tunnelling projects, notably WestConnex. Proactive and comprehensive measures to ensure adequate monitoring and compensation for any property damage are essential to provide assurance to Northbridge residents.

We recommend that the NSW Government monitor and publicly report on the new Community Complaints Mediator for the project to ensure that the improvements being sought regarding community engagement and complaints handling are achieved.

Finally, consistent with the recent request by the NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment to the Project Team, we support consideration of alternative locations to the dive site proposed for Flat Rock Gully. Community consultation will be key in exploring alternatives.

Should the Beaches Link proceed, the NPA strongly believes the NSW Government needs to address our concerns and recommendations to ensure community expectations are met. The NPA are committed to advocating for our community through this project assessment and have set up a sub-committee skilled with government regulatory experience at the highest level, legal, accounting, community engagement and external environmental management advisory support.
