I'm against the Western Harbour Tunnel & Beaches Link as it is a wast of Public Money investing in expensive public infrastructure to benefit a relevantly small population and to promote the use of motor vehicles. The proposed Link is short sighted as it is an investment connecting to an existing road network that is subject to sea level rise as it hugs the low lying areas along the Northern Beaches coast requiring further investment in the future to defend this system whereas a much better investment would be an tunnel (bridge) extension of the rail system from Chatswood to Dee Why where the rail system would branch north to Mona Vale and south to Manly using the high ground behind the proposed low lying existing road system.
