As an ex vet nurse I saw the horrific condition many of these puppies and occasionally the parent dogs, that had been rescued, were in. The parent dogs are often kept in such terrible conditions and simply there to pump puppies out for monetary gain. No regard is given for the dogs life or well being and the female dogs are often bred over and over until they are no longer able too. Some are lucky and find rescue homes, some are killed.

Puppies are often inbred and end up with a range of debilitating medical complications which cause stress on both them and their new owners. I have seen dog owners unable to process how their 12 week puppy is so sick it may never make it to see it's 1st birthday. Parvo, distemper and hepatitis are all common, and usually fatal, illnesses that presented.

Please, please stop puppy farms! Make it so that the majority of dogs come from registered and monitored breeders for their sake and future owners.
