I am making a submission urging the NSW Parliament to work together in order to strengthen laws around the breeding of dogs and cats. Puppy farms are not the way to breed dogs. These situations leave the mother dog in an isolated and usually filthy living situation. Once exhausted of her usefulness, the mother is not taken care of. Some are dumped on pounds and in bushland. The mother dogs are forced to stay in small quarters or tied up. They cannot get out to toilet and therefore the situation is filthy. The dogs are not socialised. Once rescued (if they can get that lucky) they are difficult to socialise, because they have not idea how to related to other dogs and to humans.

The pups of dogs bred this way can have genetic problems and they aren't socialised in the way that pups from a reputable breeder are.
