INQUIRY INTO TEACHER SHORTAGES IN NEW SOUTH WALES

To Whom it may concern,

I'm writing to you in complete dismay about the future of my kids education. Last year I started paying for private tutoring as I have no feeling of security that the education of my children is front and foremost concern of NSW education system.

COVID aside actual teaching at schools is becoming an after thought for the education department. My kids constantly have to be merged into other classes because their teacher is away due to COVID or has other commitments that eat into their teaching time such as Assistant Principal or attending sporting activities. Unfortunately there are not enough casual teachers to fill these gaps and super vision is not ideal.
