Re: Parliamentary Inquiry into the Impacts of Metals Mining on Human Health and the Environment

The ABC 730 Report that exposed some of the impacts that heavy metals from Newcrest's Cadia gold mine is having on people's health and the environment.

The report states levels of lead up to ten times higher than NSW Health recommendations have been found in resident's drinking water near the Cadia mine, while disturbingly high levels of heavy metals such as nickel and selenium have been found in people's blood.
