Recently I watched a story on ABC 730 which exposed some of the effects that heavy metals from Newcrest's Cadia gold mine is having on people's health and the environment.

Levels of lead up to ten times higher than NSW Health recommendations have been found in resident's drinking water near the mine, while disturbingly high levels of heavy metals have been detected in people's blood. This seems to have been the catalyst for the media becoming involved. The EPA became involved and a small fine was issued. This does not resolve the problem nor mitigate the effects of this disaster.

The proposed Bowdens lead and silver project near Mudgee and McPhillamys gold project near Bathurst are 2 examples of mines that have been recently given the green-light.
