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I gave birth in a public hospital in January 2034, I was a first time mum and terrified. My water broke at home and was filled with meconium so I needed to go to the hospital, once at the hospital I was told I needed t be examined, I was not prepared for a vaginal exam and this wasn't explained to me. I was told I now needed continuous monitoring, which meant no birthing/labouring in water which had been my plan. This was incredibly heartbreaking and led to me not sleeping for days and ending up back in hospital due to feeling mentally unstable.
