INQUIRY INTO PROPOSED ENERGY FROM WASTE FACILITIES

I am a husband, father, son, and hardworking local citizen who, along with my family, has lived in this region our entire lives. I have chosen Parkes as the place to live and raise my family, purchasing a home here so my children, aged 12 and 3, can grow up in a safe and healthy environment.

I am writing to strongly oppose the proposal to build an Energy-to-Waste incinerator in our community. I urge decision-makers to reconsider this reckless plan and identify a more appropriate location—one that does not directly threaten the health and wellbeing of my family, my neighbours, or the wider community.

While I understand the need for renewable energy solutions and recognise that Australia faces challenges with landfill capacity, this project must not come at the expense of human health, livestock safety, or environmental integrity. There are safer, more responsible ways to manage waste that do not endanger communities.

It is deeply concerning that this decision appears to have been made without sufficient scientific testing, community consultation, or transparency. The process has caused widespread anxiety, fear, and frustration among local residents, and the potential long-term impacts on our health, livelihoods, businesses, and financial security have not been adequately considered.

It is hard to escape the impression that this project is being driven by greed and short-term gain rather than genuine concern for the people who live here. Those involved in advancing this proposal should reflect on whether they would be comfortable living just metres away from an incinerator processing 600,000 tonnes of Sydney's waste each year — so close to homes, schools, workplaces, and children's play areas.

I am extremely disappointed in the local council and government representatives who have allowed this proposal to progress to this point. To even consider constructing such a facility so close to town demonstrates a serious disregard for the people they are meant to represent.

I therefore formally oppose this proposal and request that alternative waste management solutions be investigated — options that do not pose risks to human health, the environment, or the wellbeing of local communities.

If this project were to proceed, my family would be left with no choice but to sell our home, likely at a loss, and relocate to escape the constant stress and fear associated with living near such a facility. No family should ever be forced into that position.
