### **Introduction**

My name is \_\_\_\_\_, and I am a resident of **Bogan Gate in the Parkes Shire**. My family and I purchased our property here in **2018** after carefully considering many areas across New South Wales. We chose this location for its **clean air, open space, and high-quality farming country**—a safe and healthy environment we believed would provide the best possible conditions for our family, particularly for our daughter, who had undergone a **liver transplant** just two years earlier.

After receiving medical clearance from our daughter's transplant team, we moved permanently to Bogan Gate at the **end of 2019**. Since then, we have embraced life in this community and become deeply involved in both local employment and community life.

### **Our Family's Connection to the Community**

My husband operates a **mobile heavy vehicle mechanical business**, servicing clients throughout the Parkes Shire and surrounding districts. I am employed in **administration at the local Returned Services Club**, where I manage **BAS, payroll, and accounts payable**.

We are both proud and active contributors to community projects and local events, including:

- The **Trundle Back in Time Tractor Pull**
- The **Trundle Show**
- The **Trundle Bush Tucker Day**
- The **Bogan Gate Village Fair**
- Membership in the **Parkes Antique Motor Museum**

Our 2 daughters attend **Bogan Gate Public School**, and we take pride in supporting the school and our small rural community in every way we can.

### **Concerns Regarding the Proposed EfW Incinerator**

The proposal for an **Energy from Waste (EfW) incinerator** in this region has caused our family significant concern and distress. Our **daughter's health must**

**always come first**, and the potential impacts of air pollutants, particulates, and other emissions from an incinerator pose an unacceptable risk to her well-being.

When we chose Bogan Gate, it was precisely because of its **clean environment and unpolluted air**—conditions essential for our daughter’s long-term health. The introduction of an EfW facility in proximity to our home undermines that safety.

If the project proceeds, we will have **no choice but to relocate** to protect her health. This decision would not be made lightly, but the **risks to her immune system and overall wellbeing** are too great to ignore.

### **Broader Community Impacts**

Our potential departure reflects a broader issue for rural communities like ours. The establishment of an EfW facility in the region will likely result in:

- **Loss of skilled local workers** — my husband provides essential mechanical services to the area.
- **Reduced local employment participation** — both of us are actively employed and contribute to local business and economic activity.
- **Declining school enrolments** — fewer children attending our small village school threatens its sustainability.
- **Reduced community engagement and volunteerism** — many of the events and projects we support depend on local families willing to contribute time and effort.

These are not just numbers or statistics; these are the lifeblood of rural towns. The introduction of an EfW incinerator risks eroding the very fabric of the community that makes the Parkes Shire such a strong and vibrant place to live.

### **Conclusion**

We chose this area for the **purity of its air and the quality of its environment**, both critical to our family’s health and happiness. The proposed EfW incinerator threatens those very reasons we—and many others—call this region home.

The potential environmental, social, and health consequences far outweigh any perceived economic benefits. We strongly oppose the building of an EfW incinerator near Parkes or any other locality in NSW. For our family, and for others like ours, the risk is simply too high.

We respectfully urge the Inquiry to consider the **human and community cost** of these proposals, particularly for families living with serious medical vulnerabilities.

The rural communities of the Parkes Shire stand to lose not just residents, but the heart of what makes them thrive.
