Submission – Concerns About Proposed Waste Recovery Facility

My name is **Lisa Read**, and I live in **Peak Hill** with my husband **Michael**, our children, and grandchildren. My **parents-in-law** live next door on one side, and on the other side is our **daughter and her four children**. Three of our children and two grandchildren live with us, and altogether our family includes **seven children and eleven grandchildren**. One of our children and three grandchildren go to school locally, and all the adults in our family work across the **Parkes Shire**.

I am a **proud Wiradjuri woman** living and raising my family on **Bogan River Country**. I drive the **local community transport**, run a **girls' group** and a **homework centre**, and spend much of my time helping families, Elders, and children in our community. My **faith and culture** guide everything I do they've taught me to care deeply for others, to protect our Country, and to always look out for those around me.

Our home and our community are built on strong family and cultural connections. That's why I am deeply worried about the proposed waste recovery project. It doesn't align with **Wiradjuri lore or values**, and our **Elders have not been consulted**. For us, respect and consultation are not optional they are part of who we are.

This development raises serious **health, cultural, and environmental concerns**. We live along the **Bogan River**, which holds life and meaning for our people. There are **heritage and burial sites**, including **Snake Rock**, that must be respected and protected. Once Country is damaged, we can't undo that.

I also worry for the wellbeing of our community. Our **school, medical, and support services are already stretched**, and our families are working hard to close the gap. A project like this risks undoing the progress we've made by putting extra pressure on our land and our people.

We are raising the next generation here children who deserve to grow up healthy, safe, and proud of who they are. They should inherit clean water, strong Country, and a community that values their future.

For these reasons, I strongly believe the **Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)** process must be **put on hold until the current inquiry is completed**. Moving ahead now would ignore proper cultural process and community input. Our Elders, families, and local people need to be genuinely heard before any decisions are made.

Thank you for listening to my concerns and for taking the time to consider the impact this project could have on our Country and our community.
