Attachment 1 – Labor's plan for before and after school care

Capital grants fund

Labor would expand the Government's capital grants fund to a maximum allocation of \$50,000 for the creation or expansion of BASC centres. Non-Government providers (eg YMCA, Councils, catholic schools, etc) would continue to be able to make applications to this fund.

Practical support for schools

A Labor Government would commit to the establishment of a Before and After School Care unit within the Department of Education to assist principals identify space within existing schools for the creation of new BASC centres and guide them through the development application process.

Reforms to BASC tender

A Labor Government would ensure the highest weighting within any tender for the operation of a BASC centre is parent fees, ensuring that cost of living is valued higher than rental return. Labor would also provide a 10% loading for not-for-profit providers during the tender process.

New schools to have OOSH or Preschool on site

All new public primary schools built by a Labor Government will have a BASC centre (or preschool) located on site.
