Attachment 1

1. Labor will commit to an environmental vision for Sydney (existing resources)

Drawn from the Greater Sydney Commission's Independent Environmental Panel, the vision sets out the following principles:

- A city that values its unique environmental landscape and biodiversity; and which all citizens can enjoy and protect
- A healthy city with clean air and water and sufficient green open space and tree cover providing widespread opportunities for relaxation and exercise
- A resource-efficient city where the environmental impacts of water and energy supply and disposal of solid, liquid and gaseous waste are minimised
- A resilient city, able to cope with extreme events
- A city that knows and values its history

2. Labor will develop a publicly available inventory of environment assets to define and guide protection and enhancement of Sydney's Green Grid and open spaces (existing resources)

The inventory will document bushland, parks, golf courses, street trees, streetscapes, walking and cycling transport corridors, urban agriculture, green roofs and green walls.

The inventory will be available as publicly accessible data and maps, and it will be formally linked to land use planning. The inventory will be considered in all planning instruments and decision making.

3. Labor will provide stronger protections of our environmental assets through planning laws, policy and practice (nil impact)

Labor will review and refine policies and legislation to ensure that the elements that make up the green grid and other environmental assets have the protection that is needed to maximise the multiple benefits provided by our green spaces, our trees, our waterways and our local heritage areas.

4. Invest in our trees by expanding on the Government's commitment (\$12.5 million new money)

Labor will invest new funding and redirect existing funding to invest in programs that assist local government, state government agencies, community organisations and private land holders to restore, protect, maintain and enhance key elements within the green grid.

This investment would include:

tree planting programs

- tree preservation
 planning options to protect tree canopy
 funding for land acquisition for environmental, social and recreational uses
