## Notes and costing assumptions

This policy proposes recruiting an additional 100 child protection case workers in the Department of Family and Community Services (FACS). Under the policy, 25 additional case workers will be employed each year from 1 July 2019 to 1 July 2022. A full cohort of 100, ongoing, additional staff will be recruited by 30 June 2023.

The PBO estimates this proposal would cost \$22.9 million over the forward estimates, and an additional \$15.9 million in 2022-23. All costs have been escalated by 2.5% per year based on the NSW Public Sector Wages Policy.

This estimate is based on FACS advice that the average full-time equivalent cost for a Community Service Caseworker is \$116,500 (2018-19 dollars), including on-costs, and an additional \$26,700 (2018-19 dollars) per caseworker is needed to cover the cost of essential support resources, which typically includes support staff.

The PBO assumes that there is sufficient supply of qualified social workers available in the NSW jobs market to facilitate the employment of 100 extra case workers and their associated support staff.
