Notes and costing assumptions

The policy proposes to allocate an additional \$600 million from 2019-20 to 2022-23 for school construction and upgrades. The allocation profile specified by the policy is summarised in the table below.

The PBO estimates that the total cost of the policy is \$420 million over the forward estimates and \$600 million by 2022-23.

Depreciation and operating expenses of schools (e.g. employee expenses) are excluded from this costing on the basis that the types of works are not yet known. For example, the building of a new school would incur the full range of operating costs, whereas a school upgrade may have no impact on operating costs.

The PBO also notes that the NSW Government will be providing an additional \$6.4 billion for schools across the State between 2019 and 2027 under the Gonski 2.0 agreement with the Commonwealth Government. The PBO considers this to be a potential source of funds to meet any additional costs.
