Notes and costing assumptions

The policy is to establish a statutory authority for recreational fishing called RecFishNSW, from 1 July 2019.

The policy specifies RecFishNSW would replace existing saltwater and freshwater expenditure committees, as well as the Recreational Fishing NSW advisory body. The new body would continue to utilise the Department of Primary Industries' accommodation and corporate services.

The policy also specifies that RecFishNSW would be funded from reallocations from within the Department of Primary Industries' budget, totalling \$2.9 million per year plus adjustments based on the Consumer Price Index for Sydney.

The PBO estimates that the net cost of the policy is nil. The estimated cost to be absorbed is \$8.9 million over the forward estimates. This is based on the 2019-20 cost of \$2.9 million plus indexation of 2.25% in 2020-21 and 2.5% for 2021-22, which are sourced from Treasury's forecasts of the Consumer Price Index for Sydney in its Pre-election Budget Update.

The PBO considers it is feasible for the Department to absorb the costs. The Department's budgeted recurrent expenditure is \$1.9 billion for 2018-19, which indicates scope to reprioritise existing resources to fund RecFishNSW.
