## Notes and costing assumptions

The policy proposes to allocate \$50 million over fours from 2019-20, for public land management agencies to manage weeds and pests, and to establish an Independent Weeds Committee. The policy specifies that the allocation will be evenly spread between 2019-20 and 2022-23.

The PBO estimates that the total cost of the policy is \$37.5 million over the forward estimates and \$50.0 million by 2022-23. In addition, the costing assumes the allocation will be to the Department of Primary Industries, which is the lead agency for coordinating pest and weed management across NSW.
