What assumptions have been made in deriving the Establish a specialist court for Indigenous financial impacts in your estimated costing? offenders in the District Court jurisdiction. (See checklist) The transfer of jurisdiction is effectively a machinery of government change and would be met within existing resources. Additional fixed funding of \$1.5 million annually from 2020-21 would be allocated to provide greater therapeutic services relative to the standard District Court. This would have similarities to the Drug Court. The funding would be adjusted against movements in the consumer price index. The Court would be influenced by evidence of benefits of providing Indigenous communities with a level of ownership and community engagement with the justice system. The Court would be accommodated in existing Sydney metropolitan court facilities. Assume no additional capital expenditure.
