Attachment A – Women's Health Package

1) Two endometriosis and pelvic pain hubs, and support services across NSW

The hubs will be located at two sites – one in metropolitan Sydney and one in regional NSW. They will be operated by NSW Health and will be located at existing NSW health facilities. The total investment is \$16.3 million over four years for these hubs.

2) Miscarriage Support Fund

A \$2 million Miscarriage Support Fund will be established in 2023-24, to provide miscarriage, pregnancy loss and stillbirth support. This fund will be administered by NSW Health with administration costs to be met from within the existing Health budget.

3) Four new BreastScreen NSW vans

Four new BreastScreen NSW vans will be delivered and in operation by 1 July 2023 to increase screening rates. The vans will be delivered by NSW Health in partnership with a service provider, who will own and provide the vans. The cost of service delivery is capped at \$20 million over four years, based on an indicative cost of around \$1 million per van per year, from 2023-24.

4) Grants for fellowships into researching cancer

A grant program will be established to support fellowships and research into ovarian and gynaecological cancer. The program will be administered by NSW Health and will be capped at \$1.8 million per annum for four years. Administration costs will be met from within the existing Health budget.

5) Rebates for egg freezing

The NSW Government will offer \$2,000 rebates to assist women with the cost of egg freezing. These rebates will be offered for the first 2,000 applicants from 1 July 2023 and only for treatments on advice and undertaken from an approved, accredited ART provider. The policy assumes that 500 applicants will be rebated each year over four years. This is based on figures from the 2020 Australia and New Zealand Assisted Reproduction Database.
